Fire Fighting Instructions

SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling Procedures Handle and open container in a manner as to prevent spillage. Maintain

SECTION 11. TOXICOLOGICAL INFORMATION

Only acute toxicity studies have been performed on the formulated product. The non-acute information pertains to the technical-grade active ingredient, Isoxaflutole, as well as, the hericide safener, Cyprosulfamide.

Acute Oral Toxicity female rat: LD50: > 2,000 mg/kg

Acute Dermal Toxicity rat: LD50: > 2,000 mg/kg

Acute Inhalation Toxicity rat: LC50: > 2.7 mg/l

Chronic Toxicity Isoxaflutole caused liver and/or thyroid effects in chronic studies in rats and

mice.

Cyprosulfamide caused the formation of stones producing secondary irritation in the kidney and/or urinary bladder in chronic studies in rats, mice and dogs.

Assessment Carcinogenicity

Isoxaflutole caused liver and/or thyroid tumors in lifetime feeding studies in rats and mice. These effects were only seen at the highest dose tested (the Maximum Tolerated Dose) which was far higher than any exposure that could be envisaged for humans. Thus, isoxaflutole presents negligible, if any, increased cancer risk for humans.

Cyprosulfamide caused a low incidence of tumors in the kidney and/or urinary bladder in lifetime feeding studies in rats and mice. These tumors were considered to be secondary from the chronic irritation due to the presence of stones. Cyprosulfamide was considered not to be directly carcinogenic in rats and mice.

Isoxaflutole was not a reproductive toxicant in multi-generation studies in rats.

Cyprosulfamide was not a reproductive toxicant at non-maternally toxic dose

levels in a two-generation study in rats.

DEVELOPMENTAL TOXICITY:

Isoxaflutole was not a developmental toxicant in laboratory animals.

Cyprosulfamide was not a primary developmental toxicant in rats and rabbits. Developmental effects were observed in rabbits but were considered secondary

to maternal toxicity.

Neurotoxicity Isoxaflutole was not a neurotoxicant in acute, subchronic or developmental

neurotoxicity screening studies in rats.

Cyprosulfamide was not a neurotoxicant in acute and subchronic neurotoxicity

screening studies in rats.

Mutagenicity Isoxaflutole was not mutagenic or genotoxic in a battery of in vitro and in vivo

tests.

Cyprosulfamide was not mutagenic or genotoxic in a battery of in vitro and in

vivo tests.
